General Session

- Council Training Records:** John Gailey reviewed how council training records can be updated. A District Training Chair (or designee) can take a "Not Trained" report for your district/sub-district/unit, mark up the report with any changes, and return the updated report to the council for entry into the system. Simply enter the proper dates for any training, add your name and district position on the top of the sheet, and return the sheet to the council office (Bob Norton will be the person processing these.) District volunteers may also perform an individual training record lookup through www.MyScouting.org. This is also a great tool for Unit Commissioners - they can check training records for all of their leaders through www.MyScouting.org.
- Collecting BSA membership IDs would be a good thing to collect for advanced training courses. This would allow course directors to verify that pre-requisite training has been completed by participants before their course begins.
- Our annual Course Director's Conference will be held in Payson on January 8, 2011 at 9:00 a.m. We need everyone to submit room requirements for your training classes. We will have a session for District Training Chairs, where we will talk about the All Trained - Phase 2. We will also have training for new District Training Chairs. It was recommended that we have a combined Quartermaster training session - either one this date or later in the spring.
- If any districts/units want to hold a Kodiak course or a Venturing Powderhorn course, they need to contact Dave Wilson to get this set up and get the proper



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forms for submission. We highly encourage these courses - but we need to do it in an organized way.

5. Committee Reports

a. Basic Training:

- i. Cub Scout position-specific training can now be done online. Doug is leaving it up to the districts on whether they offer classroom-based Cub Scout position-specific training or not. He recommends that they do.
- ii. The October training session at the council office will not have Cub Scout training because of lack of trainers.
- iii. Leader-specific training courses at the council office no longer require lunch to be purchased - it is optional. Doug welcomes feedback from District Training Chairs on this issue.

He has taught this at Northstar and Roundtables. He usually takes about one hour to teach the course. This course is targeted at new/young adult leaders before they take youth out into the outdoors. 7. John Gailey briefly reviewed the Unit Charter Renewal for 2011 and the Youth Protection Training requirements. All direct-contact leaders on a unit charter must complete YPT in order to be included in the 2011 charter. These adults can be placed on the charter electronically, but the system will inform the processor that a YPT completion certificate must be submitted in order for the person to be included on the charter.
